2	COP.8.c	Is informed consent obtained by the person performing the procedure or a designated doctor from the team?		
3	COP.6	Do records indicate who administered sedation, include monitoring records, and define shifting criteria from the recovery area?		
4	AAC.6.d	Are TLD badges of staff working in the endoscopy suite (where procedures like ERCP are performed) monitored and records maintained?		
5	AAC.6.a	Is appropriate radiation/imaging signage displayed in procedure rooms where C-arm is used?		
6	AAC.6.a	Are lead aprons and TLD badges available and in adequate numbers in the endoscopy suite?		
7	AAC.6.a	Are statutory requirements such as valid AERB license complied with where radiation equipment is used?		
8	MOM.2.b	Are high-risk medications and LASA drugs identified and stored safely in the endoscopy area?		
9	COP.2.c	Are defibrillator and resuscitation equipment available and functional in the endoscopy suite?		
10	MOM.7.c	Are batch and serial numbers of ERCP stents, colonic stents, etc., recorded in patient medical records, master logbook, and discharge summary?		
11	MOM.7.b	Is patient and family counselling documented for ERCP stents and other stents used in endoscopy?		
12	IPC.2.d	Is there written guidance on sterilization practices followed in the endoscopy suite?		

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
